OPERATIONAL REFERENDUM APRIL 1, 2025

On Tuesday, April 1, 2025, our community will vote on a proposed \$1,750,000 non-recurring operational referendum to exceed the revenue limit for four years. An approved referendum would begin with the 2025-2026 school year and end with the 2028-2029 school year.

COST FACTORS

Since 2020, CSD operational expenses have outpaced revenues. One of the main factors has been inflation. In that time, total revenues increased by total expenses have increased by 12%.

Notable cost increases:

UTILITIES: 51.5%

SPECIAL EDUCATION: 34.9%

TRANSPORTATION: 33.1%



STEPS WE'VE ALREADY IMPLEMENTED

- ☑ Cut total expenses by 12% over the past 5 years
- Reduced staffing by nearly 10 FTE over the past 2 years
- ✓ Used one-time ESSER funds to fill budget gaps
- ☑ Absorbed a ONE-TIME budget deficit for 2024-2025
- Delayed infrastructure projects: facilities, maintenance, and technology
- ✓ Delayed purchasing activities/athletic equipment











PROJECTED PROPERTY TAX IMPACT

An approved referendum would have a tax impact of \$0.71 for every \$1,000 of assessed property value in our community.

ARE WE ALONE?

Only 2 Columbia County School Districts are not utilizing an operational referendum. Thelast 2, Columbus & Randolph are both pursuing an operational referendum on April 1st.

These districts have passed an operational referendum in the past 12 months: Cambria-Friesland, DeForest, Fall River, Marshall, Rio, Sun Prairie, and Waunakee.

Since revenue limits were introduced, a total of 356 school districts asked voters an operational referendum question

In 2024, a total of 148 operational referendum questions were asked state wide.
